PATNA: Local industries, particularly micro and small businesses, had broken into rare applause in September last year, when the Nitish Kumar-led cabi-

applause in September last year, when the Nitsh Kumar-led cabinet approved the long-awaited Bihar Procurement Preference Policy 2024. Fourteen months later, they are realising nothing has changed despite government assurances to encourage procurement from local industries. Portrayed as a game changer for local industries, the policy envisages that contractors engaged for work of the Centre and the state government agencies would procure at least 25% equipment or material from local industries and other preferences to support local entrepreneurs. However, the state government has not yet set up the state purchase preference standing committee, the basic step towards implementation.
