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# CM Nitish stresses 'jobs to locals' on Buxar SEZ visit

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**BUXAR:** The Nishank Kumar-led NDA government has begun implementing its plan to develop two special economic zones (SEZs) spanning 250 acres to boost industry and investment in the state. The rapid industrialisation and consequent generation of employment through industries has been one of the main agendas of the government.

Chief minister Nitish Kumar on Monday reached Nawanagar in Buxar district on Monday and inspected the rapidly developing industrial area.

Deputy CM Samrat Choudhary was also present with him on the occasion.

The Centre in 2024 had given its approval for development of two SEZs at Kumarbagh (Beti) and Nawanagar (Buxar), putting Bihar on a new path of industrial competitiveness. The Kumarbagh SEZ in West Champaran will cost ₹16 crore and the Nawanagar SEZ will cost ₹102 crore. BIADA (Bihar Industrial Area Development Authority) has allocated 150 acres for the Buxar SEZ. These SEZs are likely to generate 10,000 jobs directly and indirectly.

On Monday, the CM inspected Pepsico and ethanol plants, asking the company management to provide employment to maximum number of local people.

## NITISH ASKED THE OFFICIALS TO SOLVE ALL THE PROBLEMS ARISING IN THE INDUSTRIAL UNITS PROMPTLY TO FAST TRACK EMPLOYMENT GENERATION

Nitish asked the officials to solve all the problems arising in the industrial units promptly so that the process of employment generation and industrial development could be accelerated.

The ethanol company's CMD

Ajay Singh informed the CM that the Centre was only purchasing ethanol for six months. Production stopped for the remaining six months. He urged annual ethanol procurement be ensured for uninterrupted operations. The CM assured he would raise the matter before the Centre.

Rajpur MLA Santosh Kumar Nirala assured local villagers that to provide maximum employment to local youths, he would discuss the matter with the CM. Kumar also inspected the wildlife rescue centre being developed focussing on treating and protecting local wildlife, especially endangered blackbucks. He also inspected and

conducted an aerial survey of the under construction bridge over the Ganges.

Recently, industries minister Dilip Jaiswal had said the government was extremely serious and committed to the SEZ project. He had said the two SEZs would be equipped with world-class technology and facilities.

The SEZs are expected to cater to various industries, including manufacturing, IT and ITES, pharmaceuticals, and agro-processing. These sectors hold immense potential for growth and job creation, particularly in states like Bihar, which are poised to capitalise on their demographic dividend.

# Govt mulls BSF along the lines of CISF for Bihar

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**PATNA:** The Bihar government is planning to set up a Bihar Industrial Security Force (BISF) on the pattern of the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) to provide a secure environment for investors and industrial units. With the establishment of BISF, the government is giving a clear message that investors should come without fear, the state will take care of the rest of the responsibility, land, facilities, security and administrative support. Entrepreneurs will be assured that there is a dedicated force to protect their units and desire to set up their industries.

Industries minister Dilip Jaiswal said a detailed proposal would shortly be presented before the cabinet for approval. Under the plan, BISF will operate as an exclusive unit focused on safeguarding industrial establishments. Experienced personnel from Bihar Police will be deployed in the force, to be headed by an IPS officer. DSP-rank officers and inspectors would also be a part of the command structure. The force would be responsible for securing not only factory premises but entire industrial clusters. The services would be available to new investors as well as existing industrial units, the minister added.

With several new investors planning to establish industries in Bihar and multiple clusters already being developed, the government believes a dedicated security mechanism will boost confidence and support smooth operations. Entrepreneurs have long demanded a specialised security system for industrial areas, as units currently depend on private security arrangements. The creation of BISF is expected to fulfil this long-pending requirement and strengthen the state's industrial ecosystem.

The state has allocated ₹26,000 crore for the next phase of industrial development. Chief secretary Pratya Anand presented a five-year roadmap aimed at positioning Bihar among the top-performing states, with an investment target of ₹50 lakh crore over the next five years.

Earlier in October 2021, Bihar Special Armed Police (BSAP) force was given the responsibility of working on the lines of CISF. It was given the responsibility to handle security at the world heritage Mahabodhi temple at Bodhi Gaya and Darbhanga airport under the provisions of the Bihar Special Armed Police Act 2021. Currently, the BSAP unit also handle the security of industrial areas, big institutions, and Patna Metro project.



## Work with more vigour, PM to NDA Bihar MPs

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**PATNA/NEW DELHI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday met NDA MPs from Bihar and asked them to work with more vigour for the welfare of the people after the ruling alliance's resounding victory in the recent assembly elections.

He said "with great victory comes great responsibility". The PM interacted with each alliance partner and stressed the significance of the NDA's victory in Bihar, said the leaders who attended the meeting. In the 243-member Bihar assembly, the NDA secured 202 seats, paving the way for JD(U) supremo Nitish Kumar return as CM for the 10th time.

Among the alliance partners, the BJP won 89 seats, JD(U) 85, LJP (Ram Vilas) 19, Hindustani Awam Morcha (Secular) 5, while four seats went to the Rashtriya Lok Morcha.

# Demand grows for CM's son Nishant to join JD(U)

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**PATNA:** Political circles in Bihar are once again abuzz with speculations of a possible entry of CM Nitish Kumar's son Nishant Kumar into politics, after posters featuring the CM and his son surfaced outside the JD(U) office.

The posters read, "Nitish ka sevak... Nishant ki mang... Ab party ki command sambhalen Nishant bhai, Nishant's followers demand Nishant... Now Nishant bhai should take charge of the party." These posters, congratulating Nishant Kumar on being sworn in as CM for a historic 10th time, claim that Nishant is the future leader of the JD(U).

The speculations gained ground after JD(U) national working president Sanjay Kumar Jha while speaking to media recently said party workers, supporters, and well-wishers wanted Nishant to join the party and contribute to its work. However, he emphasised that the decision ultimately rested with Nishant Kumar himself.

"We all want the same, but now it is up to him to decide when he will join," Jha said.

Earlier, Nishant Kumar had commented on the NDA-JD(U)'s emphatic victory, saying it was the blessing of the people of Bihar. He said the public had once again placed their trust in his father Nitish Kumar and the NDA government.

# Fake drugs of branded firms seized

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**PATNA:** A joint team of Aurangabad police and Brand Protection Services Private Limited raided the residence of a market in Town police station area in Aurangabad district and recovered a huge quantity of counterfeit products of various renowned brands. Following the raids, dozens of many shops were shutters and CCTV cameras

were installed outside the shops. Police were stunned to see counterfeit products of Eris Oaknet HealthCare private limited and Alliance Pharmaceuticals Limited.

The police also seized counterfeit medicines and cosmetic products of Torrent Pharma and companies including Himalaya, Ahaglow Moisture, Ecelsa Moisture etc. During the raid one Mohd Shafiq was detained for interrogation. Police recovered wrappers, empty bottles and

caps. It was also revealed that this racket was being operated by one Amit Yadav, who hired a shop in the market of Shafiq.

"An FIR has been registered against named and unknown people on the basis of the statement of Mazza Ahmad, field officer of Brand Protection Services private limited under section 318(4) of BNS and 63/65 copyright Act 1957," said police officer Umesh Kumar of Town police station.

## RJD LEADER SHOT DEAD IN MUZAFFARPUR

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**BETHAH:** A Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader, who also worked as a contractor, was gunned down by bike-borne assailants in Muzaffarpur district on Monday, police said.

Shivendra Singh, Station House Officer (SHO) of Rampur police station, said the incident took place at Dharmpur Chowk, RJD's Muzaffarpur district president Ramesh Gupta identified the deceased as 35-year-old Mantu Shah, the youth president of Muzaffarpur panchayat under Champaran block.

Police said the motive behind the killing is yet to be ascertained. "CCTV footage is being examined," a police officer said. An angry mob blocked the road at Dharmpur Chowk for nearly four hours in protest.

As well have been written in invisible ink when it comes to GeM, a manufacturer in Fatuha industrial area said. According to BIA, another loophole is the Proprietary Article Certificate (PAC). Departments have simply stopped mentioning brands in tender documents (which would have invited local preference scrutiny) but quietly attach a PAC saying "XYZ brand is acceptable because it is proprietary".

In a letter to the CM, BIA has asked for immediate investigation and notification of the Standing Committee, publication of a list of items where "sufficient local capacity exists" so that Clause 7(2) (local-only bidding) can be invoked by the industries department. Additionally, the turnover and experience criteria should either be scrapped for local units or related to 100% of tender value. There shall be explicit rules for extending preference on GeM portal and the tender documents shall ask for only product-related standards (BIS, NABL, raw material, etc.) and not the company certifications.

# Nearly 14 months on, purchase preference policy remains a non-starter, without panel

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**PATNA:** Local industries, particularly micro and small businesses, had broken into rare applause in September last year, when the Nishank Kumar-led cabinet approved the long-awaited Bihar Procurement Preference Policy 2024. Fourteen months later, they are realising nothing has changed despite government assurances to encourage procurement from local industries.

Portrayed as a game-changer for local industries, the policy envisages that contractors engaged for work of the Centre and the state government agencies would procure at least 5% equipment or material from local industries and other preferences to support local entrepreneurs. However, the state government has not yet set up the state purchase preference standing committee, the basic step towards implementation.

The policy envisaged setting up of the standing committee headed by the chief secretary to monitor its implementation. Clause 21 of the policy clearly

says the committee must meet at least once every three months.

"Zero meetings in fourteen months," a senior Bihar Industries Association (BIA) functionary said on anonymity. "Without the committee, there is no monitoring, no grievance redressal and most importantly, no one to call out departments that quietly ignore the policy," he added.

A former BIA president said tenders were being floated in a manner to not only defeat local industries from bidding, but also to allow the contractors supply the materials procured outside the state. The new policy, issued by the finance department, making it binding on every single department, PSU and agency, stipulates up to 50% relaxation in turnover and prior experience for local units vis-a-vis other agencies. Contractors have been mandated to do local sourcing wherever capacity exists.

A couple of weeks ago a delegation of BIA met the development commissioner to plead for realistic implementation of the purchase procurement policy, especially when the government has been striving to now invest-

ments. "Tenders worth hundreds of crores for furniture, electrical items, hospital supplies, uniforms continue to be awarded to suppliers from Gujarat, Maharashtra, Delhi even when local units are ready with the same specifications," reads a letter sent to the CM by BIA president Ram Lal Khatri.

Another BIA functionary claimed the departments were adopting tricks to insert unnecessary certification demands that act as entry barriers for Bihar units. "For example, a tender for PVC pipes will suddenly ask for ISO 9001 certification of the bidder instead of just BIS marking on the pipe," he said. A senior officer of the industries department said over 85% of government procurement now happened through the Government e-Marketplace. "The 2024 policy is completely silent on how local preference will be extended on GeM. As a result, a micro-unit in Muzaffarpur making steel almirahs finds itself competing directly with a ₹500-crore company from Pune on pure L1 basis. The policy might
